

## Use of ACIE Logo

**The images should not be reduced or altered in anyway.**

1. The logo must be used in conjunction with approved text.
  - 1.1. The approved text must include the name of the individual who is a Full Member of ACIE.
  - 1.2. Reference to his/her Full Membership can be general or to the specific Category of Full

[X] is a [ Associate/Full Member/Fellow/Member/Licentiate] of ACIE

Or

These accounts were Independently Examined by [X] who is a [Full Member/Fellow/Member/Licentiate] of ACIE.

2. Anyof the following may also be used:
  - 2.1. ACIE - promoting excellence in independent examining
  - 2.2. see [www.acie.org.uk](http://www.acie.org.uk)
  - 2.3. registered charity in England and Wales 1077154 and Scotland SC039066

3. Text only:

Any of the text above may be used on its own (together with any text from 2.3), without an accompanying ACIE logo, in the circumstances described at 5 below.

4. Where the logo cannot be used.

The logo must not be used in a way which could mislead readers into thinking that:

- someone who is not a Full Member of ACIE is a Full Member;
- that a firm or organisation, as opposed to an individual, has Full Member
- status (see also ACIE Code of Ethics, 10.2 and 10.3).

- in addition, the ACIE logo should not be used where the Full Member has only prepared the accounts and has not been responsible for their examination as well.
5. Where the logo can be used assuming the above requirements are met.
- on letterheads, compliment slips and related office stationery;
  - on promotional materials;
  - on Full Members' websites;
  - on reports/accounts where the Full Member has been the Independent Examiner
  - and where the charity agrees to the use of the logo, at which point, the wording at 2.2.b above becomes appropriate;
  - on social media accounts.
- 5.1 Where the Full Member has been involved in the preparation of a charity's accounts
6. If a Full Member wishes to use the ACIE logo in any other way, s/he should consult the ACIE office.
